A very busy week in school with transition to new classes and a school trip, almost rounding off our 'Looking Back, Looking Forward' term!

In EYFS, the children have become 60 terrific paleontologists with their growing bank of dinosaur knowledge! This week, they have painted dinosaur footprints; written dinosaur poems; drawn and labelled dinosaur life-cycles, revisiting learning from last term; investigated bones; made puppets; created 3D drawings, and used their tallying skills to complete dinosaur surveys. What experts!

Our year ones stepped back in time, visiting the medieval Berkeley Castle. The stain glass window workshop was great fun and the classrooms look much brighter with the children's work displayed in the windows. They have also been writing their own versions of 'George and the Dragon', using the castle setting as inspiration; their new year two teachers were very impressed with the quality of their writing, including fantastic joined handwriting. Well done year one!

In year two, the children have been looking both back and forward, revisiting their reception classes, whilst EYFS and Y1 visit their new classes, as well as a session at the Juniors. They have been busy rehearsing 'Pirates and Mermaids', including a dress rehearsal, and have completed some fantastic posters to advertise this to their families. Both year one and year two have also been learning to tell the time: in year one o'clock and half past; in year two, as year one, but also quarter past and to and to five minutes. Please do practise this at home as it can be difficult to master.

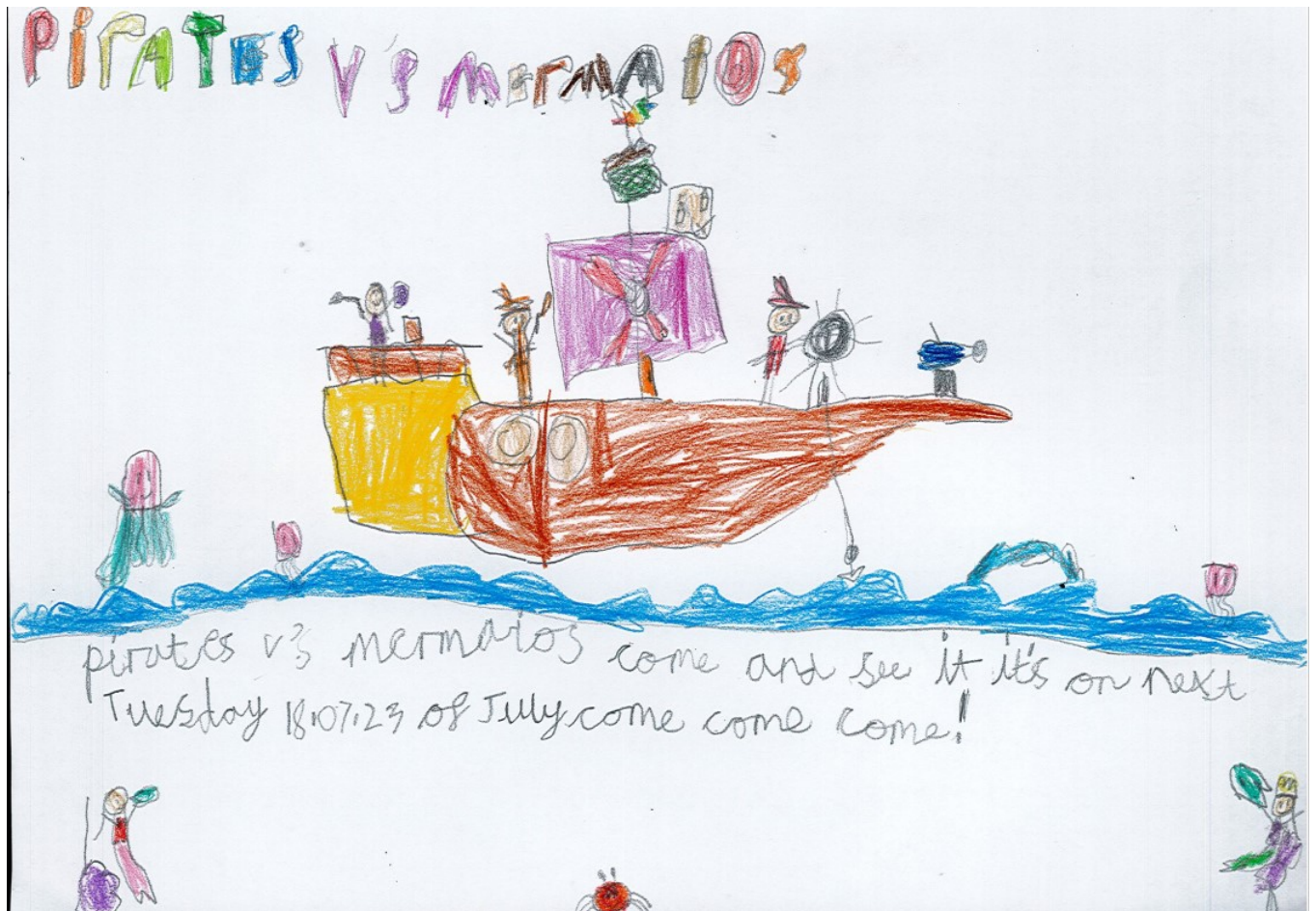

Frequently asked questions:

Classroom doors next year

Please note that next year, the gates will open as usual at 8:40 but classroom doors will open at 8:45 and close at 8:50 *with children expected into school by 8:50*. The window was extended during Covid but it is appropriate now to revert back to an 8:50 start, which supports the children's learning as lessons can begin more promptly. The vast majority of children are in class by 8:50 so we hope that this will not cause any difficulty for families.
