Mrs Perry-Hodge's weekly update

Our EYFS children all stayed for lunch this week and enjoyed playing outside the teddy bear's footprints, using all areas of our school grounds. They also visited the Fred room for the first time as next week, they will start phonics there, learning in smaller groups to support their early reading development.

After following routes around the school's grounds last week, in year one, the children enjoyed a local walk in the (eventual) sunshine. They observed physical and human geographical features, after which they drew maps of the local area. Due to the mysterious disappearance of 'Bog Baby', they have produced very informative, descriptive 'Missing' posters in case anyone had seen him - now displayed around the school. Well done Lions and Penguins!

Our year twos have also been working on descriptive writing, creating some fantastic character and setting descriptions based on 'The Bear and the Piano', focusing on the 'power of three' and carefully chosen verbs. Following their visit to Bristol last week, they created their own maps of the route they took on the trip, including a key of features included. In art, they have applied their sketching techniques, such as cross-hatching or circular hatching, to create beautiful pencil sketches of our Bromley Bears.

Across BHI, we are focusing more than ever on different elements of reading this year. As a staff, we are dedicating more time to listening to children read, supporting essential development of fluency; your continued - and crucial - support at home really feeds into this with children 'Fred talking' and recognising words with increasing ease. Please also see attached reading champions information; it really is a rewarding role for those who are able to spare the time and with school budgets more challenging than ever, your support and time would be much appreciated. A final reminder around healthy snacks: please send your child to school with a healthy snack, such as fruit, a savoury cracker or yoghurt each day.


