This week at BHI, our EYFS joined years one and two for their first assembly to celebrate 'Harvest Festival'. The children listened to a story called 'Be Kind' and reflected on how individual, small acts of kindness join other acts of kindness and make a big difference. We were all very impressed by what 'Concentrate Bears' they are becoming already. This has also been shown by their focus in their phonics sessions, of which families got a flavour this week during the very well-attended workshop. Thank you to our 'Friends of School' for your time and for providing cheese and wine afterwards.

In year one, the children have continued their learning about seasons in science, using this and their book 'A Stroll Through The Seasons' as inspiration for writing. To mark Black History Month, their history learning has considered the actions of those who have campaigned for positive change and against discrimination by focusing on the bravery of Rosa Parks' bus protest in the USA and the Bristol Bus Boycotts locally. It is the 60th anniversary of the Bristol boycotts so a particularly pertinent year to be reflecting on the actions of Guy Bailey, Roy Hackett and Paul Stephenson.

Following on from work developing their vocabulary and descriptive skills, this week the children in year two have been writing their own stories inspired by 'The Bear and the Piano'. We have been impressed by the quality of their writing, including expressive words choices, and hope that families enjoy them during today's open afternoon.







In year one, during their harvest play project, some children made baskets to collect the harvest in. Children can also be teachers too!
