Our Cracking Ideas term is continuing with

much invention in all classes. In EYFS, the children have been innovating 'The Three Little Pigs', making or drawing animal characters for their own stories as well as designing and building houses; they have also applied 3D shape knowledge, learnt earlier, to make or build models of Tower Bridge. Brilliant engineer 'Imagine Bears'!

Our year ones have continued to learn about space: this week reading about Mae Jemison (they all agreed she was a great example of a 'Keep Going Bear'), making their own books with space rockets ordered chronologically. The books were made using origami skills learnt earlier in the week, which required a lot of concentration. In exciting news, the children are also entering artwork of birds into a national competition, giving them a great purpose to their creativity. All of their 'book club' books have also related to stories about real or imaginary astronauts and they have had great discussions about their favourites. Fantastic 'Concentrate Bears'!

We have all been so proud of our year two writers this week: they have been innovating the story of 'The Tin Forest', really focusing on using a range of adjectives to describe the setting and characters - we think that you will be very proud when you read them in next week's 'Time to Shine'. In Design and Technology, the children designed and made wheelbarrows so the old man would be able to tend to his forest. These involved using wheels, axles, pivots, levers, washers and upcycled boxes from home! The focused atmosphere in the classrooms was amazing, as was their independence in using the tools. Sixty 'Try New Things Bears'!

Many thanks to Mr Blackburn; Mrs Rudge, Mrs Choudhuri and Mrs Mitchell who are coming in to EYFS to talk about their jobs as part of the children's learning about 'people who help us'. 
The cost for the club is £5 a session so £25 for the term for five sessions (this cost includes all materials). There will be a maximum of 15 children for this club, and they will take part in a different project
