



Mrs Perry-Hodge's weekly update

Art week has been a fantastic end to term five's theme 'What's at the bottom of the garden?' The whole school has been a hub of creativity, imagination and innovation. A 'Norbot' sculpture will soon be arriving at BHI and in preparation the children have all created a design: next term, Mrs Woodhams will use elements from a range of these to decorate our very own Norbot sculpture, which - later in the summer - will form part of the Norbot trail before returning to BHI as a permanent piece of art (see more details on page 4). In EYFS, the children also drew step-by-step versions and in year one they created card and paper sculptures of Norbot. In year two, the children sculpted clay Norbots in a workshop with local ceramicist, Kirstin Whitney: these are currently drying but will be fired over the holidays and then returned to be painted.

Each child through the school has also painted a canvas, applying painting skills that they have learnt over the year. In EYFS, the children used their tinting and colour mixing skills to create beautiful paintings based on the sunflower from Emily Hugh's 'The Little Gardener'; in year one, the children painted stunning pieces based on Van Gogh's 'Pink Peach Tree in Blossom', tinting colours and using different brushstrokes, and in year two, the children applied skills of a graduated tint and perspective to produce canvasses based on David Hockney's 'Late November Tunnel'. In addition, year one have created mini-beasts using modelling clay, inspired by their science this term; year ones have revisited sculpture skills from earlier in the year, creating colourful paper birds, and year two learnt sewing skills to make padded fabric birds.

All of the above are displayed in our art gallery for you to enjoy and admire! Finally, an ENORMOUS thank you to our fantastic art leader, Mrs Woodhams, who has arranged this amazing week.

A message from our lunch time team below

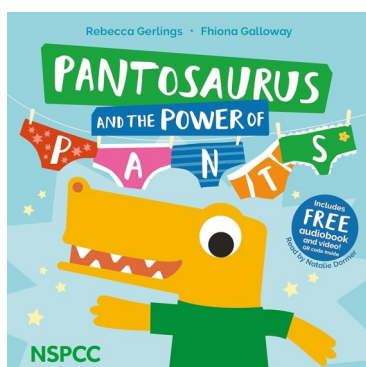
We are the ladies who look after your lovely children at lunchtime. We all also work in different roles across the school, and are very interested in making their lunchtimes an enriching time.

We are excited to announce that our school is taking part in Gromit Unleashed 3, the award-winning art trail returning to the streets of Bristol this June.

As part of the Gromit Unleashed Schools Programme, our pupils will have the opportunity to contribute to the design and decoration of our very own mini sculpture of Norbot, the 'smart gnome' from Aardman's latest Wallace and Gromit film, Vengeance Most Fowl (each child had produced a design over the week with our gnome being painted next term). Our finished sculpture will be part of the Gromit Unleashed 3 exhibition, before returning to our school as a permanent legacy of our creativity and community spirit.

An added bonus is that this project supports The Grand Appeal, the dedicated charity for Bristol Children's Hospital. As part of the programme, we have already raised £500 - at the Christmas plays - to buy the gnome and help fund life-saving equipment, pioneering research, and vital support for sick children and their families. However, we hope to raise still more for this fantastic charity, which help so many children across the UK, including some past and present pupils at BHI. With this in mind, we will be fundraising in term 6 and there will also be an opportunity to donate to the Grand Appeal at the art gallery on Friday 23rd May.
