Term 6 theme: 'Looking forwards, looking back'

Over the last few weeks in EYFS, the children have been closely observing their visitors transformation: watching as caterpillars hatched from eggs; then turned into chrysalises, before emerging as butterflies. This week, the children said goodbye and released the butterflies into the sky. Thinking about next year, they also completed step by step drawings of lions and penguins.

In 'looking back', both year one and two enjoyed history workshops this week, linking to their curriculum. In year one, the children met Mrs Rattle - a toy shop proprietor from the past - and acted out being different toys, including spinning tops and toy soldiers; sang songs, and worked collaboratively to put their bodies into shapes of toys, including train tracks. Year twos loved their active workshop, learning about Victorian seaside holidays: swimming costumes; changing booths, which holiday makers wheeled down to the sea so nobody saw their skin; donkey rides, hokey pokeys (ice cream) and Punch and Judy shows - characters the children felt needed to focus on being 'Understand Others Bears'.

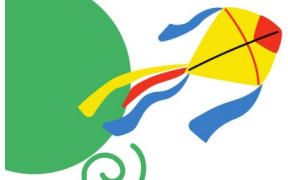
