



Mrs Perry-Hodge's weekly update: T5 theme 'What's at the Bottom of the Garden?'

This week, in EYFS, the children have been learning all about animal life cycles, including frogs (having seen the tadpoles grow and develop in the classroom) and butterflies. They have drawn and labelled examples; created animals on the 'make and create' table with card and pipe cleaners, and built habitats. Their book clubs have been all about frogs also so Fred is not just helping with phonics now but supporting learning about the natural world!

Beanstalks replaced sunflowers in year one this week, with the children writing excellent descriptive pieces from Jack's (very annoyed) mum's point of view. I enjoyed listening to the children read their work out loud with expressive and dramatic effect. They have also been learning about different food groups, including thinking about foods that come from different plants and animals, before designing their own sandwich using garden produce and tasting breads to decide which one to use for their sandwich next week. Year twos have continued their science learning about plants. They now have three investigations ongoing: do all seed germinate in the same way?; which temperature conditions are the best for seed growth?, and which light conditions are best for optimal plant growth? They are being brilliant scientists, observing closely and measuring growth, as well as ensuring fair testing by watering each sample with the same amount.

In a lovely linked event to our termly theme, today is Sir David Attenborough's 100th birthday. In EYFS and year one, the children completed play projects based on his life and contributions to the natural world. Ideas included building an animal sanctuary (carefully separating the lions from the zebras); making binoculars; a collage of Planet Earth and - of course - birthday cards. A joy!
